TRINITY SUNDAY JUNE 15

The first Sunday after Pentecost is the Festival of the Holy Trinity. On this day, the church rejoices in the impenetrable mystery that God is triune (three-in-one) Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

- How the Lord can be one God in three distinct persons is completely beyond the ability of any human to understand.
- By the power of the Holy Spirit, Christians accept this incomprehensible mystery as a fundamental article of faith.

Trinity Sunday is a transitional day that bridges the season of Easter from the Sundays after the Pentecost, two parts of the liturgical year. This is the solemn day on which we praise and adore God both for what He has done for the world and for who He is.

As it is so beautifully confessed in the Athanasian Creed:

*We worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity,
 Neither confounding the Persons nor dividing the Substance.
 For there is one Person of the Father, another of the Son,
 and another of the Holy Ghost.
 But the Godhead of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost
 is all one: the glory equal, the majesty coeternal.*

The liturgical color for Trinity Sunday is white. White represents the holiness and perfection of God.

PENTECOST

The Birthday of the Church and so much more!



On June 8th we celebrate the Day of Pentecost, the 50th and final day of the Easter Season. On that day we remember the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles that ushered in the beginning of the Church. It was 50 days after Jesus' resurrection and the apostles were gathered together, probably confused, scared, and contemplating their future mission and purpose. On the day of Pentecost, a spiritual flame blew through Jerusalem and rested upon the shoulders of the apostles and they began to speak in various languages by way of the power of the Holy Spirit. Thus Pentecost is the day for all Christians to gather and celebrate two very important realities: the Holy Spirit and the Church.

In the early centuries of the church the Pentecost feast lasted a whole week and the Sunday of Pentecost became a special day set aside for baptisms. During our 2014 Pentecost, we will condense the week long celebration into one special day, holding the celebration during our Sunday worship service that will be filled with word and song, and we will also celebrate the sacrament of baptism as Jalen Bear becomes a member of the church through water and word.

Where will you be on the Sunday, June 8th? How about joining us as we together celebrate the birthday of the church. How about gathering with all of the members of ALC on that special day, wearing red - the color of Pentecost, and raising your voices in hymns of thanksgiving for the gift of the Spirit. How about coming together as God's people and remembering your baptism, your spiritual birthday. How about gathering together to recall how the Spirit of God moved through the apostles, giving them a voice to share words about God's love and hope that we continue to hear and follow today.

Kick-off is on Sunday, July 13. We are to furnish 15 dozen cookies.

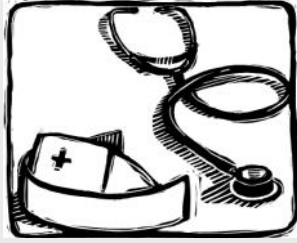
Wednesday, July 16 is a Day Camp with meal at 5:30 p.m. and program at 6:30 p.m. ALC is to furnish deserts for the meal.

Our 3rd annual **POLKA WORSHIP SERVICE** will be held June 15 at 9:00 a.m. Rehearsal on Tuesday, June 10, for those helping with the service.

This special worship service, utilizing polka music to sing praise and to celebrate God, will feature Earl Lundin on accordion. Well-known polka tunes like Erika and Beer Barrel Polka will be heard; however, the verses we sing invite the gathered people to worship God, to praise God's never ending love, and to celebrate the Lord's awesome grace.



The practice of setting the worship services to polka music began over 20 years ago and is an extremely popular worship style in the north central United States. What makes the Polka Worship so unique is that the entire service is set to popular polka tunes with Christian words.

Worship should be a celebration and polka lends itself to this. Martin Luther reportedly used secular forms of music as a basis for church music. Adding Gospel messages to well known folk tunes allowed largely illiterate populations to learn the message better.

The entire service promises to be an uplifting, toe-tapping experience!
